James W. Miller is the Executive Director of Global Production Control & Logistics for Nexteer Automotive and is also a member of the Executive Staff. Over the next 14 years, he accepted assignments in many areas of the Finance staff, advancing to assistant finance director. After Chevrolet in Bay City, these assignments took him to Chevrolet / CPC Flint Manufacturing & Inland Fisher Guide (Flint, Mich.), AC Spark Plug (Flint, Mich.); ACG Headquarters (Troy and Pontiac, Mich.), Saginaw Steering Systems (Saginaw, Mich.) and Delphi Energy & Chassis (Kettering, Ohio).

Miller returned to Saginaw in 1999 as Assistant Finance Director for Delphi Steering. He was on special assignment from 2001-2002 to help Delphi Steering create a strong production control organization, focusing specifically on level scheduling, inventory control and information flow mapping. In 2003, he was appointed Assistant Director of Production Control & Logistics and was appointed director in 2005. Miller was named to his current position on April 24, 2006.
